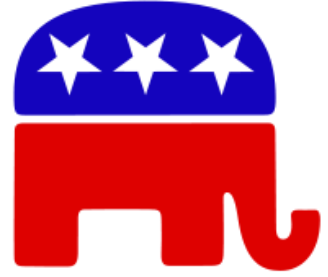

Minutes
Tuesday, October 19, 2010

The regular meeting of the North Brevard Republican Club was held on October 19, 2010, at LaCita Country Club. President JB Kump called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was recited. Mr. Kump gave the opening prayer.

Guest to be self introduced was State Representative Elect, Tom Goodson, Dist. 29.

Mr. Kump asked for nominations from the floor. There being none, the slate was accepted as presented.

Representative Steve Crisafulli was introduced. He is a Merritt Island businessman elected to the FL House in 2008. He is a rare 4th generation Brevardian and was educated at BCC and the University of Central Florida. He is Vice Chairman of the Natural Resources Appropriations Committee. Mr. Crisafulli spoke about the upcoming November 2nd election. He said that Ms. Sink, candidate for Governor, is a tax and spend candidate and is no different than those politicians coming out of Washington, DC. He emphasized the importance of electing Rick Scott as FL Governor, as it is believed he will continue the work that Republicans in Tallahassee have begun. He discussed the fact that business is being attracted to Florida because of attempts by the Republican Legislature to keep the costs down for such development. He stressed the importance of defeating Amendments 5 and 6, as those involve redistricting. Mr. Crisafulli emphasized the importance of the Agriculture seat on the ballot. The state has water issues and the EPA wants to enforce their standards on the State of FL which would add disastrously to the costs of business.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, November 16th. In December, there will be a special holiday meeting with refreshments.

Sue Hinnant won the 50/50 drawing. The meeting adjourned.
